Vision

NHORA is responsible for the oversight of all clinical research activities within Norton Healthcare (NHC). Such activities include:

Compliance/Regulatory:

- Compliance/Regulatory review of every study submitted to Norton Healthcare
- HIPAA compliance
- Regulatory submission to the Institutional Review Board (IRB) for Norton employed groups and continued regulatory oversight for life of the study
- Liaison with the University of Louisville Institutional Review Board and Western Institutional Review Board
- Perform compliance audits of research studies performed within a NHC facility
- Maintain Norton Healthcare's HHS Federalwide Assurances (FWA)
- Serve as Liaison with federal and state agencies

Finance:

- Financial review of every study submitted to NHORA
- Contract and budgeting
- Financial management of research revenues and expenses
- Management of research billing/claims for research subjects treated in NHC facilities
- Responsible for the annual budget process for all research groups at NHC
- Study Manager/Reveal Administrator for NHC

Education:

• Gaining Essential About Research (GEAR) program development and administration
